

English Language summer reading and tasks.

The A Level consists of two exams and two pieces of coursework:

Exam 1 = Language Change: The current and past changes of the English language.

Language and the individual: Analysis of different types of text. Analysis and comparison of language in its social context in two texts.

Exam 2 = Language acquisition: How we learn to talk, read and write.

Language varieties: Where language comes from, who it is for and what is its purpose? Two discursive essays. One on diversity of language and one on attitudes to language.

Course work includes an investigation on a subject of your choice and a piece of creative writing.
